## New Year/New Person

<sup>23</sup> For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24 and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus.... (Romans 3: 23-24)

New Years Day is a time for making resolutions such as to exercise more or lose weight. However, most resolutions are abandoned by the end of the month. Why is that? Because, "All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." And it is for that reason that I strongly discourage making resolutions. We are attempting to redeem ourself under our own power and that will always fail and lead us further into despair.

So, here's what I would recommend you do instead. Pay attention to verse 24 of Romans 3, "And all are justified freely by his [God's] grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus." Look to Jesus to redeem your sins and weaknesses.

Here's how to do that. Take a good honest look at the past year and write down every regret you have. Then turn every regret into a prayer; start by confessing the sin that led to that regret and ask Jesus to redeem you from that part of your sinful nature. Admit that you are powerless to change and you need his help. Ask Jesus to help you with the temptations that lead you into that sin. This is by means an easy or enjoyable task but it is well worth the effort because you will come out the other side a better person with a stronger faith. When you do this, you will be amazed at the results because you will see miracles begin to happen.

I would also like to point out that you don't have to limit this practice to just New Years Day. This would be a good practice to do every day before you go to sleep. I guarantee you will sleep better and with God's help you will learn to live a better life.

## **Christian Education**

The Children's Christmas Program during Worship Service on December 24th was a big success. Thanks to everyone who participated in the program.

We found the following information on children attending the Worship service that we want to share. Please keep this in mind if bring a child to Staves.

"Children should attend worship services with their parents. Some adults worry about including children in the sanctuary during worship. However, children will not learn what it means to be a part of a worshipping congregation if they aren't allowed to participate. Children look primarily to adults for examples on how to live until they are about nine years old. After that, they begin looking to their peers for answers. This nine-year window is important for setting the foundation of faith for the moral and ethical choices that your children will make as they grow into adults."

If you are a member of the Education Committee, please plan to attend the meeting this month. We will be setting the dates for the 2024 activities and determining the VBS program for the year.

The Chosen 3 Study is now complete until Season 4 is released to the public on the Angel Web Site. Once that release happens, new dates for that study will be set and shared with everyone.

Remember that we have an elementary Sunday School program and a Youth Sunday School program. Both of these start at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday mornings. We also have an Adult Study Program that starts about 8:45 a.m. and discusses information on hymns.

# <u>UWFaith News (A.K.A) Petticoat</u> Patter

Starting in late 2023 and now moving into 2024 we are trying to get the new sleeping mat weaving ministry going. This ministry uses plastic bags from a store to make a sleeping mat. The bags are cut into strips. Those are linked together to make "plarn" (plastic yarn). The plarn is then woven on a loom to make a six-foot by three-foot mat.

Any mats that are completed will be given to the Urban Bicycle Food Ministry. We are planning to weave on the first couple Wednesdays of the month as part of both the Dorcas Circle and the Esther Circle. The Dorcas circle will continue to work on quilts, but if extra people are available they can work on mats. Some people may also be working on them at least one Thursday each month.

There are several jobs associated with the mat weaving. Some people can flatten out and fold the plastic bags. Some people can cut the bags. Some people can weave. All people that work on the mats and their time is tracked so we can report the hours to Midwest Mission in Jefferson. The time spent working on the mats is part of their mission program.

## **MISSION FOR JANUARY**

The season of joy and peace is not over; I want to thank all of you for giving to the Bidwell Toy Pantry and the homeless. Your heart must be 10X its size. What you do for God's work is outstanding. Yet it is another year and times have not changed.

This month we will be supporting Heifer International. <u>https://www.heifer.org/</u> We have supported this organization the past several years. Last year we sent two sheep at \$300 per animal to two families who will shear the sheep and sell the wool and raise and pass along any lambs that come, earning a living and feeding themselves and their community.

That is the beauty of Heifer. We provide animals to those in need. In turn, they raise, sell the produce from the animal, and share the young with their neighbors who in turn continue the process, thereby uplifting an entire community. In addition to the use of animals, Heifer also provides the means to obtain fresh water in the community, schooling for girls (who are usually left out of education), access to health care, and a safe and secure environment. All of this is fundamental for a life free from hunger and poverty.

In 1944 Heifer International started in the Midwest with one man who wanted to change the way relief was given to the hungry and the poor. Rather than giving food, he felt that giving them animals would provide a steady supply of nutritious food for the entire family. In the beginning, the organization shipped actual livestock to other countries; they were cared for on the voyages by seagoing cowboys: ranchers and farmers who lent their expertise to the organization. That organization now provides expertise, capital, technology, and other resources for success to small farmers.

This month we are looking at two different Heifer projects. The choice is yours. Please vote by marking the two gifts that interest you most. On the first Sunday in February the top two gifts will be announced. All funds given during January will go to those two gifts. Thank you!
