

⁶We know that our old self was crucified with him [Jesus] in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. 7 For one who has died has been set free from sin. (Romans 6: 6-7)

All too often Christians focus on only half of the good news of our salvation in Jesus Christ. Jesus died and was resurrected not only to free us from the penalty of sin but also to free us from the power of sin. As the Apostle Paul stated, "our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing..." Did you catch that? Our old self was crucified with Jesus. . . . that is our old sinful self. If we're dead to sin then how can we, as a Christian, continue to sin?

I'm glad you asked. Later in the Bible at 1st John 5:17 it says, "All wrong doing is sin, and there is sin that does not lead to [eternal] death." The type of sin that leads to eternal death is lawlessness; which means having no moral standards at all. The type of sin that does not lead to eternal death is when we do wrong and we recognize it and immediately repent of it.

But let's face it, we all have that one sin that we go to when we're feeling stressed or bored, or out of control. It might be food or over spending or gossiping or thinking too highly of ourself and looking down on others. Christian author, David Mains, refers to this as, "Our Signature Sin." Have you ever asked yourself why you keep doing it? The answer is simple; we continue doing, "Our Signature Sin(s)," because **WE LOVE IT!** We absolutely love it. It has power over us and it has enslaved us. Only Jesus Christ can break that power by changing our heart. By a change of heart, I mean we are enabled to see that sin the way God see's it and we are disgusted by it.

The only way our heart can be changed is if we surrender that sin to God and ask God to change our heart so that we see our favorite secret sin from His perspective. Will you surrender?

SLEEP IN HEAVENLY PEACE

Is about beds. Sleep in Heavenly Peace is a national organization that provides beds for children who do not have a stable place to sleep. It was started in a garage IN Twin Falls, Idaho, by a family that knew of a child without a bed. It has grown exponentially. Many of the children are sleeping on the floor, the couch, or a chair. In a car, rolled up in a blanket or coat or other covering, with at least one other or more children. Take just a moment and think about what it would have meant to you if your child had not had a bed to sleep in. Or your grandchild, or your neighbor's child. Physical, mental and emotional well-being is much better with a good night's sleep. They are better in school and interacting with their peers.

Currently, forty-four states have chapters in them. Iowa has fifteen chapters. The motto is: NO KID SLEEPS ON THE FLOOR IN OUR TOWN!

What they do: they build twin size bunk beds complete with mattress, pillow, sheet, pillowcase, and quilt and give them to children who have no beds. They have volunteers who build beds, collect sheets, pillowcases, quilts, mattresses, and pillows. There are build days. They assemble the beds at the shop and reassemble in the home. Then the children climb in the beds, some don't leave for hours because this is their tiny space all to themselves.

We will collect funds to donate to the Des Moines Chapter. We hope to have a speaker from the local organization to give a talk this month.
