MISSION UPDATE—Report from Delia, Missionary at University of Iowa

Staves received a letter from Delia Mozqueda-Fuhrmeister in March. She writes:

"It is hard to believe that the semester is already more than halfway over! I am excited to share what God has been doing so far. Last month we had our winter Disciple Makers Conference. This conference is designed to help students learn how to be disciples of Jesus and how to make disciples in their spheres of influence. Our staff had been praying that this conference would lead students to take practical steps to grow in their faith. When the weekend was over, we were amazed at how God answered our prayers! About 12 students applied for the JAX STP, a summer training program that teaches students how to make disciples as they work full time jobs. We also had six students apply to go on an overseas mission trip during the summer. Among the students going overseas is my friend, Sydney, who I have been discipling this school year.

"....she (Sydney) mentioned that she already had plans to work over the summer as an emergency medical technician....She was also planning on joining some gatherings over the summer, where council members of her church would meet to discuss changes to her church's structure and policies. It appeared that the council members really wanted her at these meetings because they wanted the voice of a younger Christian to speak into their matters....

"However, as conversations surrounding the mission trip ensued, the Lord seemed to have closed a major door for Sydney's summer plans. Her church's council members did not end up taking her on as a representative of her generation, and she would not come to the meetings after all. The rejection was surprising to her because she truly thought it was the Lord's leading for her to go...And when the potential of going to Southeast Asia came up again, it did not excite her.

"....After much wrestling, it became clear to her that this wrench in her plans wasn't a coincidence. Proverbs 16:9 became true for her—"the heart of man plans his way, but the LORD establishes his steps."...There was still some fear in Sydney as God redirected her plans, but she was willing to take a leap of faith to let God use her in a country where most have not heard the gospel...

Thank you all for your investment in my ministry! The Lord is truly using your prayers and support to advance His gospel to the nations.
