The Greatest Commandment

I have the privilege again of writing this "pastor" article for you. At this point in time Pastor Tim and Nancy have moved and Pastor Byunghwoon Lee and Park have yet to arrive. We are between pastors for a short time. But the work of God within us and through us does not stop.

I've been reading lots of books lately getting ready for my rapidly approaching Wesley Pilgrimage to England. Yes, I'm going back to Epworth, Oxford, Bristol and London to study about John and Charles Wesley. This time our group is being led by three Welsey scholars who are also pastors. This should be a wonderful learning experience.

One thing I have noticed in my reading is how attuned John Wesley was to the "state of the Anglican church" and how that impacted the people. He realized that the Anglican church had grown stale; it became like the church in Laodicea, lukewarm. The people came but they didn't understand the formality of the service and didn't live out the great commission, because they didn't know how.

The answer was clear to John Wesley. He believed the people needed help to understand the gospel and how it really impacts their life. The bands and classes the movement used, helped people discuss their lives and how God through Jesus and the Holy Spirit led and helped them in daily life. They learned how to be disciples for God through daily life.

John and Charles were also leaders in social reform. They saw the social issues and injustice in their society and worked to change those issues. In other words, they put Matthew 22: 37-39 (37) Jesus replied, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." (38) This is the first and greatest commandment. (39) and the second is like it: "Love your neighbor as yourself." Into action for all to see. The people of the Methodist movement also put God's love into action and changed England in the process.

In some ways I think it is easy for a church and us to also become lukewarm. We come to church each Sunday for an hour because that's what you do. We don't stop and think how God's words lead and guide us. We don't look for ways to share God's love not only inside the walls, but just as importantly outside the walls of the church. Church isn't just an hour on Sunday morning; church is sharing God s love with everyone around us. Putting God's words and love into action. I hope that you have a chance soon to share the love of God through your actions in the next few weeks.

Community Meals

The Community Meal program is still going strong. This program was started in December of 2016 on the last Saturday of the month with the idea that people's budgets were probably very tight so a little help in the area of food would be a good idea.

We started by serving about 20 people those first few months. We serve a meal to anyone who comes in the door with no questions but with a smile and friendly word to anyone who comes in the door around 5:00 p.m. Now we are serving about 60 meals each month through this program.

The committee has not had time to meet to determine menus for August, September and October. Once we do those menus will be shared.

While the meal is free, donations are accepted. Any funds donated go into the Community Meal fund to help purchase the meat or other main dish ingredients.

If you are willing to help with the meal, come on the designated date at 4:00 p.m. to help set up and serve. If you want to help cook, please talk with Terri Pollard since the cooking start time varies depending on the menu.

Trustees Update

Here are the updates on the latest Trustee Projects.

First is a wonderful announcement that we get to share. The parking lot is now totally paid in full. The final check to repay the Foundation for the loan was written in early June. Thank you for your financial support for that project.

Trustees Update (continued)

Other good news for completed trustees' work includes the receipt of funds from the insurance company for the damage to the soffit at the parsonage during a March wind storm. These repairs will take place in late June.

The work to control the water issues in the basement at the parsonage is now complete. So hopefully, there will be no more water issues in that part of the basement.

We still have a project in process and that is the new video screen on the back wall of the sanctuary. We are still working with this one. We are working on getting Traviss Audio Visual in to help us mount the screen and run the video cable to it. The new large screen will help the Pastor and other speakers when sharing the Word or other announcements.

There are several other projects that we are aware of and they include:

- The flushing issue with the women's restroom in the lobby.
- Repair or replacement of the ceiling in the Education office.
- Electrical repairs in the original basement and possibly some foundation work along the west wall of the kitchen.
- Replacing the roof on the three-bay garage.
- Soffit repair on the NE side of the church.

All of these are on hold until the church finances are in better shape.

Food Pantry

The Pantry dates for July are: Saturday, July 12th and Saturday, July 26th. The Food Pantry is open from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each of those days.

The need for assistance with food is a growing problem. The numbers for May have not been calculated yet but we know from how tired we are each week that we helped a lot of families. We will share the May and June numbers in the next caller.

The Pantry could use the following items:

- Canned Soup
- Hamburger/Chicken/Tuna Helper
- Oatmeal
- Farina/Cream of Wheat
- Pancake Mix
- Cookies or baking mixes

Remember that the pounds of food coming in and going out does not include dairy items, meat items, eggs, or bakery items. The personal items are things like shampoo, toilet paper, toothpaste/tooth brushes, and laundry soap.

Thank you for your support of this program. While we are small in size, we are making a very large impact in the lives of the people we serve.
